Fishery Equipment & Technology

With over 2,000 vessels fishing on the high seas and in the EEZs of 30+ countries across the Pacific and Indian Oceans, and accounting for more than one-third of the global longline tuna fleet, Taiwan is truly a major player in the global seafood industry.

Boasting around 12,400 motor fishing vessels (as of 2017), Taiwan has an extensive shipbuilding industry comprising

high-C/P products such as propellers, rudders, hardware parts, deck machinery, outfitting facilities, fishing gear, rugged marine-grade IT products, fish aggregating devices, and fish detection equipment.

Aquaculture Techniques

Over 50 years' breeding experience has made Taiwan a global leader in aquaculture. With major breeds including grouper, tilapia, milkfish, hard clam, and cobia, Taiwan is ranked 18th in "FAO's World Aquaculture Production by Principal Producers" in terms of quantity with its major export countries including China, Hong Kong, Japan, USA, and Singapore.
